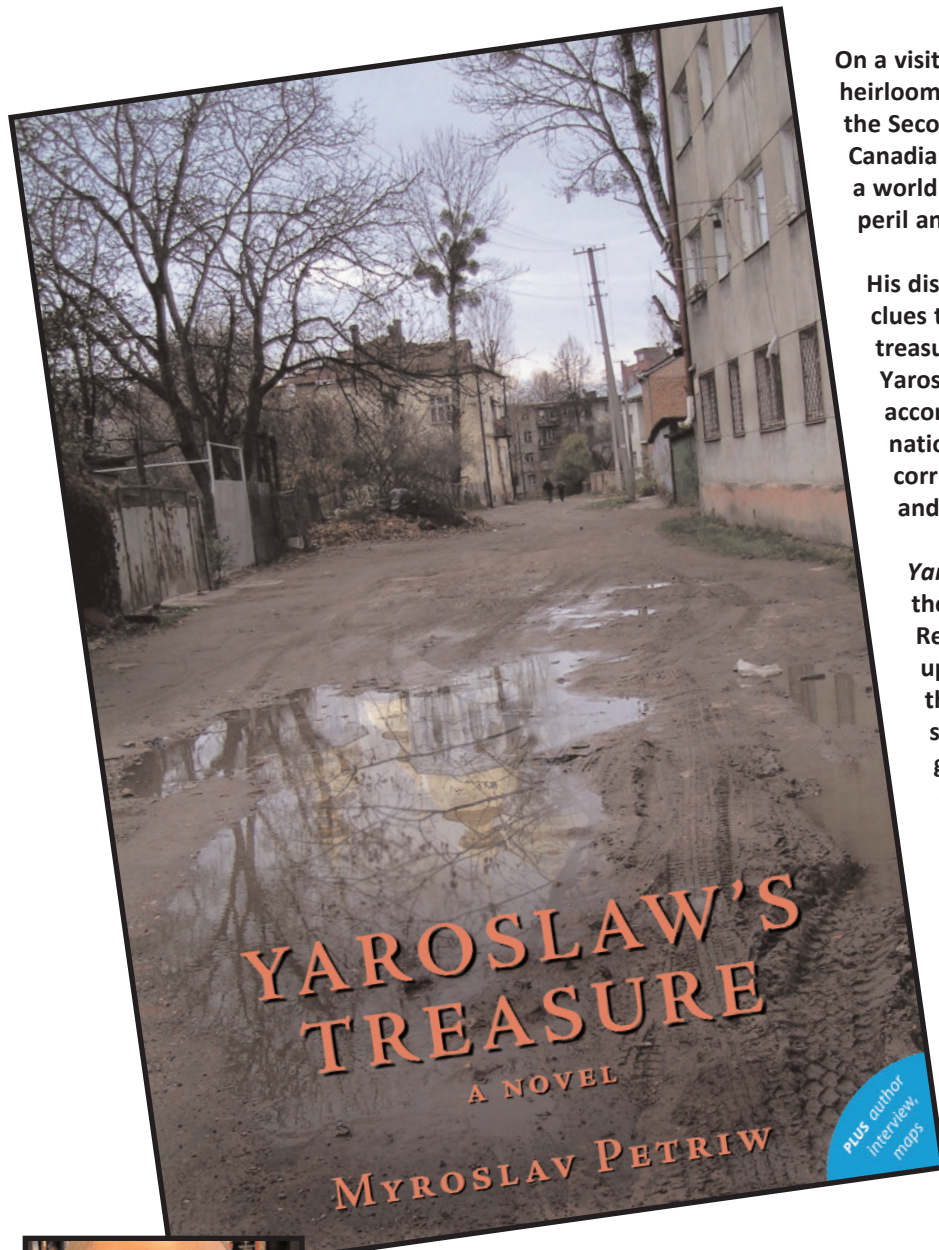


BOOK LAUNCH
